FEI Statutes, 21st edition, effective 21<sup>st</sup> April 2004, FEI General Regulations, 21st edition, effective 1<sup>st</sup> January 2005, FEI Veterinary Regulations, 10<sup>th</sup> edition 2006, The Rules for Dressage Events (22<sup>nd</sup> edition, effective 1<sup>st</sup> January 2006), and if applicable the Rules for the World Cup Dressage Events. All subsequent published revisions, the provisions of which will take precedence.

An arbitration procedure is provided for in the FEI Statutes and General Regulations referred to above. In accordance with this procedure, any appeal against a decision rendered by the FEI or its official bodies is to be settled exclusively by the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) in Lausanne, Switzerland.

**Organizers Rights:** The OC retains the right to split, cancel, or change the day of a class or to further restrict the number of horses a rider may ride in any one class, also to cancel the event under special circumstances with the permission of the US Equestrian Federation and the FEI, and return entry fees. Organizer also retains the right to secure a second FEI panel of judges if entries warrant.



**Foreign Federations:** The following foreign federations have been invited to attend: AUS, BER, BRA, CAN, COL, CRC, DEN, EGY, ESP, FRA, GBR, GER, IRL, ISR, JAM, MEX, NED, NZL, PER, PUR, RSA, SWE, SUI, UZB. A maximum of twenty riders per foreign federation and no more than four horses per rider may participate. There are no restrictions on the number of foreign riders declaring for World Cup participation. Competitors are invited by the Organizing Committee (OC) through their NF. One groom per rider. If a class has filled when an entry is received, the competitor will be waitlisted and put into a class as openings become available.

**Rider Eligibility:** Competitors must have reached or will reach their 16th birthday per FEI rules and must be licensed by their National Federation and may only take part under the jurisdiction of the NF of the country from which they hold their passport. If not of U.S. citizenship, they must be nominated by an invited foreign NF. Each rider must be prepared to produce his/her license or US Equestrian Federation membership card on request of the OC, and the name on the entry must be the same as that appearing on the license. All riders must be registered with the FEI. This information can be found on the FEI website, [www.horsesport.org](http://www.horsesport.org), under each respective discipline. Riders MAY NOT sign up for FEI Registration numbers at the competition and they MAY NOT be allowed to participate if they do not have an FEI Registration number. The USEF must receive the necessary applications forms no later than four weeks prior to the first day of competition. Please contact the FEI Registration Coordinator at the USEF for further information or visit the USEF website, [www.USEF.org](http://www.USEF.org), for the registration application forms.

**Horse Eligibility:** Horses must be a minimum of six years of age (8 years for Grand Prix). Mares may not compete after their fourth month of pregnancy or within nine months after foaling date. The nationality of a horse is that of its owner or of the country in which the company owning it is registered. Each horse must have an official FEI Passport and all horses must be registered with the FEI and have a separate FEI registration number. This information can be found on the FEI website, [www.horsesport.org](http://www.horsesport.org), under each respective discipline. Horse MAY NOT be signed up for FEI Registration numbers at the competition and they MAY NOT be allowed to participate if they do not have an FEI Registration number. The USEF must receive the necessary applications forms no later than four weeks prior to the first day of competition. Please contact the FEI Registration Coordinator at the USEF for further information or visit the USEF website, [www.USEF.org](http://www.USEF.org) for the registration application forms. The US Equestrian Federation will provide information on veterinary requirements for foreign horses entering the USA. Horses must be stabled on the grounds and may not leave during the event (commencing with the Veterinary Inspection and ending with the pinning of their final FEI class). Each horse will keep the same number throughout the event. It is compulsory for this number to be worn by the horse, competitor or handler at all times, when the horse is being handled, exercised, or shown on the grounds so that it may be identified by the stewards.

**Awards:** Awards will be distributed to 25% of participants in each competition. Prize money may be picked up at the secretary's office when competitors pick up their passports provided that there are no outstanding obligations to the committee or any supplier. Riders are to appear formally attired and mounted for all award ceremonies.

**Arenas:** Competitions will take place outdoors in 20M X 60M sand footing arenas. Warm-up will be in 20M X 60M sand footing arena.

**Expenses:** The OC is not responsible for any expenses of competitors, horses, owners, their employees or agents, and does not offer expense allowances or reimbursements.

**Stable Access:** Only properly identified riders, trainers, grooms, farrier, treating veterinarians, officials, OC members and two owners per horse will be allowed to enter the stable area. Wristbands will be used for identification.

**Logos:** Competitors may carry only the logo of their personal sponsor on each side of their saddle cloth in accordance with Art. 136.1.2.b.

**Tack check:** A steward will check the saddlery of each horse immediately after the horse leaves the competition arena. Any discrepancy will entail immediate elimination. All areas and arenas will be supervised.

**Objections:** All complaints, in order to be valid, must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of the equivalent of 150 Swiss Francs.

**Times:** Tentative class START times will be mailed to you approximately one week before the show and posted at [www.DressageShowInfo.com](http://www.DressageShowInfo.com). Official times will be posted at the office after each draw. If you have NOT been notified of your status five days before show, please confirm entry with secretary.

**Starting Order:** A draw will be held each day to determine the starting order for the next day's classes. Exact time and location of the draws will be announced and published in the secretary's office. The starting order for the Grand Prix Special will be as follows: the riders placed 11th to 15th in the Grand Prix will start first, followed by those placed 6th to 10th, then followed by those place 1st to 5th. The starting order for the Grand Prix Kur will be as follows: the riders placed 11th to 15th will start first, followed by those placed 6th to 10th, then followed by those place 1st to 5th. The starting order within each group will be determined by draw. A draw time cannot be changed. Riders must declare by the drawing on the day before the class. Once declared, a rider may not withdraw, except as specified in the FEI rules. FEI rules provide for penalties for scratches without good cause.

**Intermediaire I Musical Freestyle:** Participation in the Freestyle is limited to, and compulsory for, up to the 15 best rider/horse combinations that have declared for the Intermediaire I Freestyle and are obliged to start in the Freestyle or lose their placing in the Prix St Georges/or Intermediaire I. The starting order will be determined by a draw.

**FEI Grand Prix:** Single qualifying Grand Prix class will be offered for the Grand Prix Freestyle and the Grand Prix Special, respectively. Competitors must declare whether they are qualifying for the FEI Grand Prix Freestyle (qualifier for the US Grand Prix Freestyle Championship) or for the FEI Grand Prix Special.

**FEI Grand Prix Musical Freestyle:** Participation in the Freestyle is limited to, and compulsory for, up to the 15 best rider/horse combinations that have declared for the GP Freestyle and are obliged to start in the Freestyle or lose their placing in the Grand Prix. Should a competitor not qualify for the freestyle, their entry fee will be refunded. A rider may start with a maximum of two horses in the qualifying Grand Prix, and, if qualified, in the Grand Prix Musical Freestyle.

**Grand Prix Special:** Participation in the Grand Prix Special is limited to, and compulsory for, up to the 15 best rider/horse combinations that have declared for the Grand Prix Special and are obliged to start in the Grand Prix Special or lose their placing in the Grand Prix. Should a competitor not qualify for the Special, the entry fee will be refunded.

**Veterinary Examinations, Inspections and Passport Controls:** These will be carried out in accordance with Vet. Regs. Art. 1011 and the discipline rules. In accordance with Art. 139.1, every horse entered for any competition at CDNs, CDIs\* and CDIs 2\* in a foreign country, and all horses entered for CDIs 3\*, CDIos 2\*, CDIos 3\*, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries, must have an official FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

**Inspections:** In-stall inspections are tentatively scheduled to start at approximately 12:00 pm the day prior to start of competition. Horses will be examined to verify their identity, age, state of health, and correctness of passport. The Horse Inspection (Jog) will be held the day prior to start of competition at 4:00pm, for all competitors entered in CDI 3\*/Y competitions. Procedure for the examination will be announced on the grounds. The Person Responsible for each horse must be present unless a written request has been approved by the President of the Ground Jury. If the rider is under 18, the committee must be given the name of the adult who shall be the Person Responsible.

#### **Equine Influenza Vaccination: VET. REGS. APPENDIX VI**

All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued, must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between 1 and 3 months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.



### SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES (Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3\*/4\*, CSIs (3\*, 4\*, 5\*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016). Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

**Approved Laboratory** - USEF Drug Testing and Research Laboratory, Ithaca, NY.

**Insurance** - All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

### THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

**Stabling:** 302 10 x 10 Morton permanent stalls with doors. Blacktop floor, additional bedding recommended. No initial bedding provided, but can be purchased on the grounds. *Pre-orders are encouraged.* Competitors are responsible for stall damage. **ABSOLUTELY NO NAIL OR SCREW EYES IN METAL OR WOOD.** Every effort is made to honor stabling requests but are not guaranteed. When asking to be "stabled with" someone, please designate ONE NAME for your group in the "stable with" section of the entry form. Depending on availability NON-CDI horses *may* be stabled with CDI horses as long as appropriate veterinarian documentation is provided according to FEI Vet Regs., Annex VI. and if there is available stabling. These stabling requests are NOT guaranteed. **SMOKING IS FORBIDDEN IN THE BARN AND ADJACENT BARN AREAS.**
