### About the CSDEA High School Equestrian Club Team Championships:

The CSDEA High School Equestrian Team Championships will run concurrently with the USDF Region 4 Youth Championships and will follow the same format and class schedule. High school teams will consist of two or more students from each participating school, any competitor without a teammate will compete as an individual.

Awards: CSDEA will award medals to the first through sixth place teams and first through third place individuals. Equestrian Paradise of Long Lake will provide saddle pads to each member of the championship team and the individual champion.

Award Ceremony: Competitors are expected to dress in their formal riding attire for an unmounted presentation Saturday during the lunch break. Competitors are encouraged to promote their high school teams with signs or banners on their horse's stall. In addition, please list your high school's name on your entry form next to the rider's name.

There will be a mandatory high school competitor's meeting Thursday evening following the competitor's picnic. Competition and award procedures will be reviewed at this time. Only those riders who have listed their high school name on their entry forms will be eligible for high school club awards. The scores from the Region Four Youth Team Championships will be used for the high school team competition so feel free to ride on two teams. One with your barn mates and one with your high school team.

### About the USDF Region 4 Youth Team Championship:

The USDF Region Four Youth Team Championship is a unique show for Junior/Young Riders, featuring team competition in dressage, educational programs, team medals and a mounted awards ceremony. The United States Dressage Federation (USDF) is sponsoring a Championship in each region so youth riders everywhere can join the fun! There are *no prerequisites or qualifying scores required* to enter the championships.

**Team formation:** Teams will be organized as scramble teams. Team members can be riding at different levels. Team entries may be organized according to dressage organizations, farms, barns, instructors, Pony Clubs, 4-H Club, any youth riding clubs, or just groups of individuals. Any individual rider needing team members is encouraged to send in his or her entry and a mixed team will be formed. See, every one can attend!!



**Competitor's picnic:** All competitors are required to be present at the picnic and pre-competition meeting on Thursday at 6pm on the show grounds. Picnic is free to all riders. Others may purchase a ticket for \$10 on entry form. The competition procedures will be reviewed.

**Rules For The Championships:**

All classes are open to riders who are 21 and under competing on either horses or ponies.

**Current USEF, FEI, and USDF Introductory Level tests** will be used.

**On** the day of the competition, while on the grounds, including the stabling area, the horse or pony may only be ridden by the junior/young rider that will be competing it.

**Tests** may be read. **Whips** are not allowed.

**Training - Fourth Level dress:** Short riding or cutaway coat with tie, choker or stock tie, breeches or jodhpurs, boots or jodhpur boots, a hunt cap or riding hat with a hard shell, derby or top hat. FEI: Top hat, tails, and spurs required.

**Horses and ponies** manes need not be braided, this is optional. Neg coggins dated in current year required.

**How to Enter:** Each competitor will ride two tests of their choice from the available class list, which may be at the same or adjoining levels, except for those in the FEI divisions who will ride only one test.

**Scoring and Team Formation is outlined on the next page.**

**Award ceremony:** Riders are expected to be dressed in riding clothes and mounted for the awards ceremony held Friday after the final class. Procedures will be reviewed on Thursday evening.

**Fees for the Youth/High School Team Championships:**

Intro - Fourth: \$50 (total charge) Yg Rider, Prix St. Georges and up: \$45 (total charge)  
Equitation class/Freestyles: Free (will split by age if entries warrant)

These total fees include classes, stabling for Thursday evening and Friday day, and the competitors picnic.

**Team Formation and Scoring Rules**

**Team names:** Have fun with this! Here are some examples: The Grand Prix Wanabees, The Mountsters, Stonington Stormtroopers, Barretts Brats, The Temple Terrors, etc. *Entry form must include team name.*

Teams will be organized as scrambled teams consisting of no fewer than three riders and no more than five riders. Team riders may compete at any level. Single team members are also allowed to ride at different levels. (For example, Susie Cue on Blackie may enter Training Level, Test 4 and First Level, Test 1 and both scores will be used in the calculation of the team score.) The lowest single score of the team will be dropped. The remaining scores will be handicapped according to the scale below, then averaged to obtain a team score. The team scores will be used to place the teams within the divisions.

Divisions will be selected randomly. Divisions will consist of no more than 6 teams.

If a one horse on a team receives a score of "0" (i.e. eliminated due to lameness, jumped out of the ring, or withdrawn) then that score will automatically become the drop score. If a second horse on the same team receives a score of "0," that score will be handicapped and used in the calculation of the team score. Teams must have at least three and no more than five competitive horses in order to be considered part of the team competition.

If a horse is scratched from the competition prior to the start of the competition day, the team may find a replacement team member (another rider entered in the show who agrees to join the team and is not already on a team) or reduce the number of riders on their team. If that team has either four or five riders, then the team score will be calculated with the remaining three or four riders. If the team originally had only three members and one of those horses scratches, the team may opt to eliminate themselves from the team competition (since they now only have 2 competitive horses) or join other teams. Teams may not be restructured after the start of the competition day. Riders may not compete on two different teams with the same horse.

If a horse is forced to be scratched during the competition day (i.e. rides one test, becomes lame and is unable to compete in the second test of the day) then that horse will receive a "0" for all subsequent tests and one of those tests will automatically become the drop score. If this happens to more than one horse on a team, then the second horse will receive a "0" that will be calculated in to the overall team score.

Horses may be entered in only one test to be considered part of the team.

Riders are encouraged to enter using teams of at least four riders so that in the event of a scratched horse prior to the start of the competition does not force the remainder of the team to be eliminated. For riders who do not have a team and want to enter this show, you are encouraged to do so and you will be placed on a "manager's special" team with other riders in your situation.

Riders on eliminated teams may still be eligible for high point awards. High point awards will be awarded for the high score (Champion) and second highest score (Reserve Champion) at the following levels: Introductory, Training, First, Second, Third, Fourth, and FEI (including PSG, I-1, I-2, GP and all YR tests.)

Total percentages from each team member will be added together and averaged. Percentages will be added as a "handicap system" for figuring team placing. Riders will receive the following "additional percentages" added to their test for the calculations of team placings only: Intro/Training - 0%, First - 1%, Second - 2%, Third - 3%, Fourth - 4%, FEI - 5%. Equitation/Freestyles does not count in team scores calculations.

**Team Spirit Award:** All riders are encouraged to support their fellow teammates by helping each other braid, tack up, get dusted off, watch each other's rides, and applaud each other's efforts! In addition, keeping tack rooms in order and horses well cared for are all part of the team player's duty. A special award will be awarded to the team who best displays team spirit.

**Awards:** USDF Team medallions on neck ribbons will be awarded to each team member for first through sixth places in each division. Divisions with more than six teams will be split. Individual High Score Champion and Reserve in each division will be awarded rosettes. In addition, special awards will be awarded by individual sponsors for performance in the show.

## Back for 2006 - Cash Jackpot Classes!

**Important:** please see the "General Regulations and Entry Specification Section" in the beginning of this Omnibus for additional policies that this show subscribes to and follows.

### Class Fees:

Intro	\$25.00	Training - First/IPEC	\$30.00
Second - Fourth	\$35.00	USDF/IPEC Freestyles	\$40.00
FEI, FEI Freestyles	\$45.00	Equitation	Free

**Great American/USDF Qualifying Classes:** Qualifying classes with a **Q** in the class number will not require a separate ride. An exhibitor riding in the Open, Amateur, or Junior classes will pay an additional \$10 USDF fee to have this score entered in the Great American/USDF qualifying class at that level. Enter the class *and* the qualifying class.

### Office Charge:

\$20 per horse/rider combination -\$1 goes to admission charges

**Entry Information Requirement:** Competitors are responsible to include a copy of all memberships for horse, owner, rider, and trainer listed on entry form. A current negative coggins (within one year) must also be submitted with entry. If in freestyle class - a copy of the qualifying test must also be included in the entry.

### Late Fee:

\$25 for entries postmarked received after closing date.

### Post Entries:

Will be taken as scheduling permits - Class fee plus \$10.00.

### Rider/Handler/Horse Change:

\$25 for either rider/handler or horse change after entries submitted.

### Stabling/Tack Fees:

All horses must have a stall. No initial bedding provided.

\$40 for overnight stabling. (3pm day prior to 5pm the next)

\$75 for weekend stall (3pm Fri - 9pm Sun)

Additional nights stabling at \$40 per night. Notify management of extra nights needed.

### Bedding:

\$7 per bag if preordered (encouraged)/ \$7.50 per bag on grounds - must be made by 3PM each day. No guarantees of same day delivery if ordered after that time.

### Camper or RV:

\$25 per night on show grounds. Limited so reserve early.

### Faxed Entries:

**Faxed entries accepted provided that a valid credit card is included to hold entry spot until check and original entry arrives.**

**Non-competing horses:** \$50 for horses not competing - must fill out entry for number and pay office fees.

**Entry Cancellation/Refunds:** Cancellations only in writing either by mail, e-mail or fax prior to or on closing date. **No Refunds for any reason after closing date.** All fees collected on behalf of USEF to be submitted to the Federation. **Prior to or on closing date - entire entry minus office fee.**

**Times:** Unofficial times will be mailed to all riders one week before the show. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule. Show information will be posted on show website at [www.DressageShowInfo.com](http://www.DressageShowInfo.com). Schedule posted in office by noon the day preceding the show start.

**Awards for Classes:** Divisions (Jr/Yg, AA, Open) may be run concurrently as one class. Divisions will be pinned separately. Riders must clearly specify division choice. When no designation is made, riders will automatically be entered as open. Riders may enter only one division per class. Trophy (in classes of 3 or more) and ribbons to sixth for each class. No awards for Qualifying classes. Championships and reserves awarded for the highest percentage at each USEF/FEI level in each division.

**Accommodations:** Comfort Inn 641-423-4444, Days Inn 641-424-0210, Holiday Inn 641-423-1640, Hanford Inn 641-424-9494, Best Western 641-357-5253, Super 8 641-423-8855.

**Directions:** I-35 to Mason City - Clear Lake Exit. Take Hwy122 East. Go approximately 6 miles on Hwy 122 East to second stop light. Turn left onto Eisenhower. You can see the fairgrounds from the stop light.

**Stabling and tack:** Stalls with gates on the showgrounds. Competitors are responsible for stall damage. **SMOKING IS PROHIBITED IN STALL AREAS.**

**Arenas:** Outdoor arenas have all-weather sand footing. Warmup rings are same footing. All tests in standard arena, unless entries warrant - then some tests may be held in a small arena. Competition arenas may be ridden in up to two hours before the first ride of the day and after each day's conclusion.

**Warning: Under the Equine Activity Liability Act, each participant who participates in an equine activity expressly assumes the risks of engaging in and legal responsibility for injury, loss, or damage to person or property resulting from the risk of equine activities.**

**Hazardous Weather/Acts of God/Accident Policy:** Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, or accident. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to any Championship or qualifying classes being offered. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, or Accidents.

**Jackpot Classes:** This is a class that is open to any rider (Open, AA, Jr/YG) riding in that class, namely the highest test of that level that the Jackpot is offered. There is no additional ride or ribbons but the top three riders, based on scores, share in a jackpot of total payback of nomination fees for that level. The rider nominates for a fee of \$25 (in addition to the class fee) prior to their ride and the payback is 1st - 50%, 2nd - 30%, and 3rd - 20% of the total nomination fees for that level.

**Other:** All dogs must be leashed. Horses not entered in the show may not be brought onto the show grounds without prior arrangement and payment.
