**Entry fees:** Intro: \$25, Training - Second: \$30, Third - Fourth: \$35, FEI & Freestyle: \$40,  
Jackpot class fee: \$10 (in addition to normal class fee).

**Qualifying Classes:** Qualifying classes with an Q in the class number will not require a separate ride. An exhibitor riding in the Open, Adult Amateur, or Junior/Young rider classes will pay an additional \$10 USDF fee to have this score entered in the Great American/USDF qualifying class at that level. Please enter the class and the qualifying class.

**Post entries** will be taken as scheduling permits, with \$10 added fee per class. All other changes made after the closing date will incur a charge of \$10 per change. During the show, the Show Secretary's office must be notified by 3:00 PM the day prior to the requested ride change if available.

**Office fee-** Two shows - so please send separate entry form for each show.

**Other fees-** \$15 per horse/rider combination/per show - only one horse/rider combination per entry  
USEF fees and USDF fees listed in General Regulations and Entry Specifications  
\$10 Incomplete Charge (for entries submitted without All cards/registrations/Coggins) - (send copies) of membership in USDF and USEF of horse, owner, trainer, and rider must accompany entry. **Sorry-** No fax or credit card entries.

**Refunds:** All fees of canceled entries in writing refunded less office fee prior to closing date. No other payments will be refunded after closing date. All entries are accepted with this understanding.

**Times:** Show management will mail ride times to all riders. Check web site for times and information at [DressageShowInfo.com](http://DressageShowInfo.com). Entries taken on a *first come, first served* basis. Remaining entries received before closing date will be placed on a wait list.

**Awards:** Divisions (Jr/Yg, AA, Open) may be run concurrently as one class. Divisions will be pinned separately. Riders must clearly specify division choice. When no designation is made, riders will automatically be entered as open. Riders may enter only one division per class. Trophy and six ribbons for each class. No awards for qualifying class. Special high point awards (See show program). Championship ribbons awarded to horse/rider combo with the highest and second highest average percent. Training thru second levels must ride test 4 plus two additional tests of the level. Third and fourth level must ride test 3 and one additional test. FEI level is determined by the high average with any two FEI tests required. Champion and reserve divisions awarded to Jr/Yr, Ad Am, and Open Training thru First level. Open is the only division offered for the remaining levels. In the event of a tie, a winner will be determined by the score of the highest test. All tests at a level will be averaged excluding the Freestyle score.

**Stabling and tack:** Permanent stalls with doors available from 1 PM Friday to 7 PM Sunday. \$75.00 for the show, no bedding included. Bedding available at \$6.00 per bag. Tack stalls at \$75.00. Jump out fee \$10 per horse per show.

**Accommodations:** Super 8, 15201 S 71 Hwy, Belton, MO 816-331-0300 / RV Hookups available at \$15 per night.

**Footing:** Main performance arena are large standard outdoor arenas with sand footing. Adjacent practice arena with sand footing.



**Directions:** From the intersection of I-435 and I-470 on the SE side of Kansas City, MO: Go east on I-470, exit on Raytown Road, go right (south) for approximately 4 1/2 miles to 4-way stop (through two stop lights). Turn left (east) on High Grove and go approximately 1/2 mile to stop sign. Turn left (north) on Old Raytown Road. Horse Park will be on right, approximately one mile. Entry is well marked. *From South:* Exit Hwy 71 on Main Street in Grandview, go east (turns into High Grove) to stop sign at Old South Raytown Road. Turn left (north) on Old Raytown Road. Horse Park on right approximately 1 mile.

**Coggins:** Coggins within the past 12 months required. A 30 day Health Certificate is required by the state of Missouri for all horses. Horses not entered in the show may not be brought onto the show grounds without prior arrangement.

**Volunteers** are needed: Please contact show manager to lend a hand. This will count towards year-end awards requirements.

**Other:** All dogs must be leashed. Some tests (Intro and IPEC) may be performed in a small arena - all other tests will be performed in standard arena.

**Jackpot classes** will be held on Saturday and Sunday for Intro, Training, and First Level. In order to be eligible, the following is necessary: 1) must be entered in the designated class and test. 2) necessary to enter and ride another test of that level on the day of the Jackpot ride. 3) The Jackpot payback will be 100% of the Jackpot class fee (may include additional funds if available) and payback schedule will be dependent on the number of entries and may be divided by rider status/division if entries warrant. To enter, enter the normal class + Jackpot class (and if qualifying, the qualifying class). Fees will be Class fee + Jackpot fee (+ qualifying fee if including the qualifying designation for USDF)

## USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 130 independent organizations throughout the United States with over 31,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a long-established classical method of training horses, based upon the nature and structure of the horse, carried out in a gradual, planned program. The horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competitions at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of detrimental appliances, training aids, and traps, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature stage, dressage training is usually not voluntarily begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

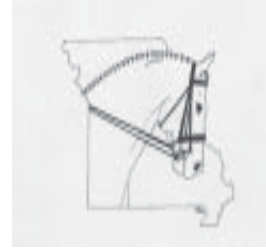
While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc. also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs that teach people how to persece the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in person-to-person education.

**Entrants please note:** Missouri Law requires that we see the original yellow copy of your recent (within 12 months) Coggins Test. We will enforce this rule.

**Qualifying Classes:** Must be entered in appropriate Open class with an added \$10 per qualifying class.

**Stabling and Tack Stall Fees:** Permanent stalls with doors; no jump-out. Stabling Fees: 1 day (no overnight): \$30; 2 days/1 night: \$45; 3 days/2 nights \$70; 4 days/3 nights \$80. A few double stalls are available for \$125 weekend. Stalls open at 3:00PM Thursday and must be vacated by 8:00PM Sunday. One bag of shavings is provided; further shavings (\$7/bag) may be ordered on your entry form or purchased from Midway Expo Center. Security is provided on Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights. Tack stalls are available at \$50 for the weekend.

**Refunds:** Before the closing date in full, less \$25 office fee. After closing date in full less \$25 with veterinary or medical certificate only.

**Post Entries:** Not accepted, with the following exception: If a scheduled ride is scratched, another horse already entered in the show may be post entered in that class, at the scheduled time of the scratch. These will be taken on a first-come first-served basis.

**Ride times:** Competitors will be notified of ride times by mail, phone, or email (if provided); times will also be posted on the CDCTA website: [www.cdcta.org](http://www.cdcta.org)

**Awards:** Trophy and ribbons through 6<sup>th</sup> place in all classes. No additional awards for qualifying classes. High score awards for Intro and FEI Levels. Champion and Reserve rosettes for Training through Fourth Level awarded to the horse/rider combination earning highest average percentage in their division (Open, Adult Amateur, Jr/YR). To be eligible for the championships the horse/rider combination must show in their division at least two days riding at least four tests in their level (three tests at 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Levels), one test of which must be the highest test of the level. Many special and breed awards, including Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal, High Score Hanoverian, Liberty Bug High Score Quarter Horse Award, Ted Sedgwick Memorial Award, and High Score American Warmblood Registry.

**Facilities:** There will be two competition arenas: A covered arena and an indoor arena. Intro, Training Level and Quadrilles (in a 20x40m dressage arena) as well as some 1<sup>st</sup> Level and qualifying Training (in the standard 20x60m arena) will be in the covered arena. All other classes will be held in the indoor arena which is slightly smaller than standard (20x58m). Both arenas have sand/soil/sawdust footing. Warm-up arenas include two outdoor arenas w/sand footing and a small indoor with sand/soil/sawdust footing. All footing will be worked as carefully as possible before and during the competition. Longeing permitted in grass field—NO longeing in any warm-up arenas. Due to facility constraints, spectator seating and show offices will be less than 20m from the competition arenas. All entries are accepted with the exhibitor's understanding of this.

Medals will be awarded by division: Open, Adult Amateur, Jr/Young Rider and Freestyle. There is a \$10 fee per level, division and horse/rider combination. Riders must be judged in at least two Show-Me designated classes, one of which must be the highest test of the level. The score from the highest test will be averaged with the highest score of the other test(s) ridden; the highest resulting average will be the Gold Medal winner, followed by the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> highest averages for Silver and Bronze respectively. Only scores from the designated division will be used in calculating the winners. A formal awards ceremony presentation in full dress with your horse will be held Saturday evening. *You must attend in formal show attire or you will forfeit your award!* Freestyles will be performed Saturday evening and the top 3 finishers in each level will be awarded medals. All Show-Me games competitors will receive a T-shirt and the privilege of marching in the opening and closing ceremonies.
